



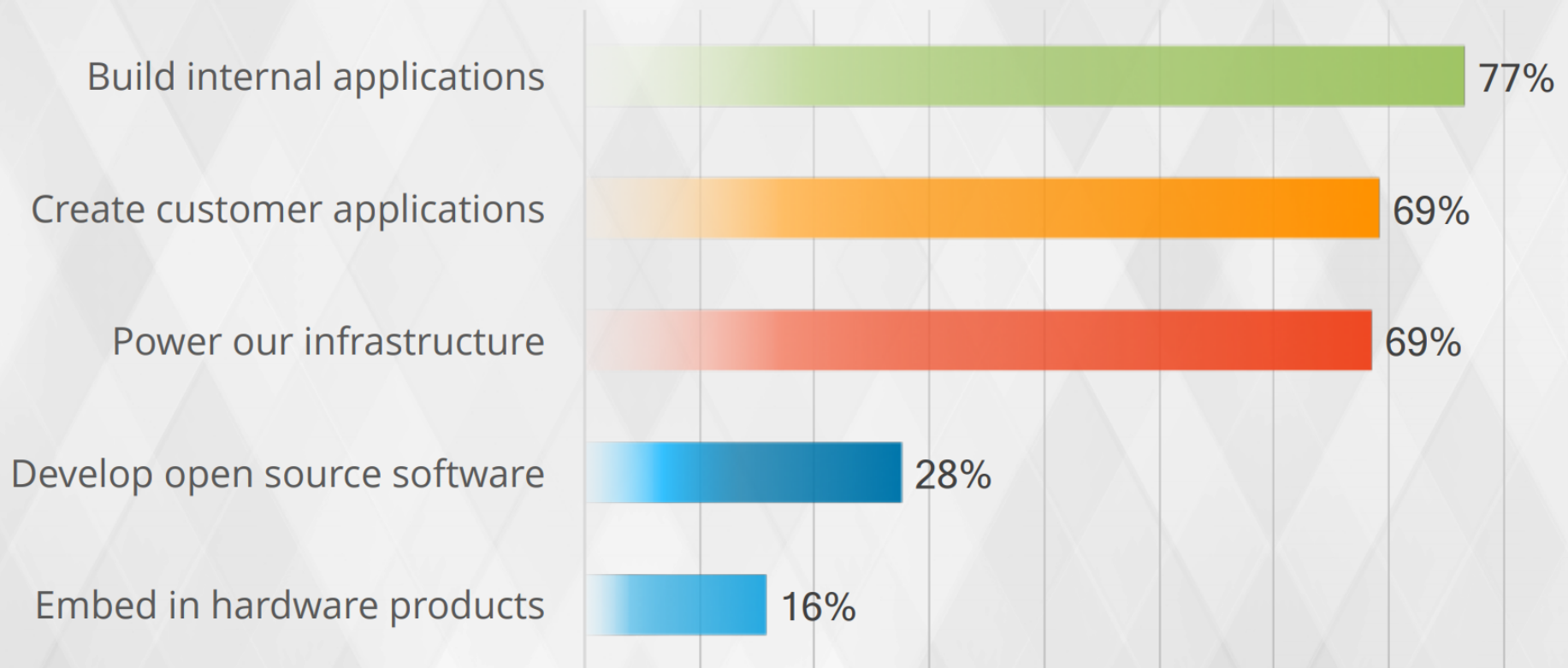

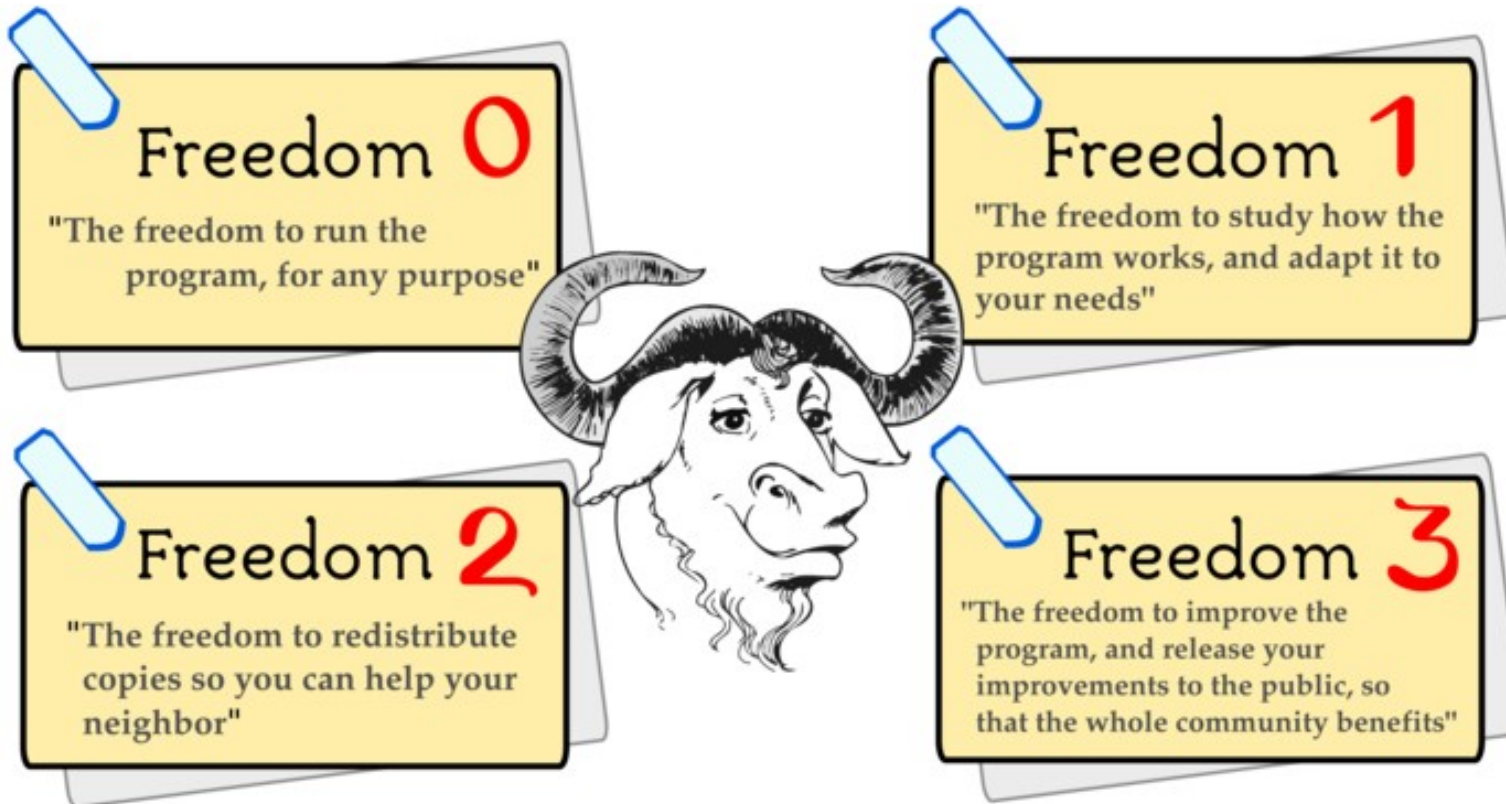

Interoperability: WebKit saves the web



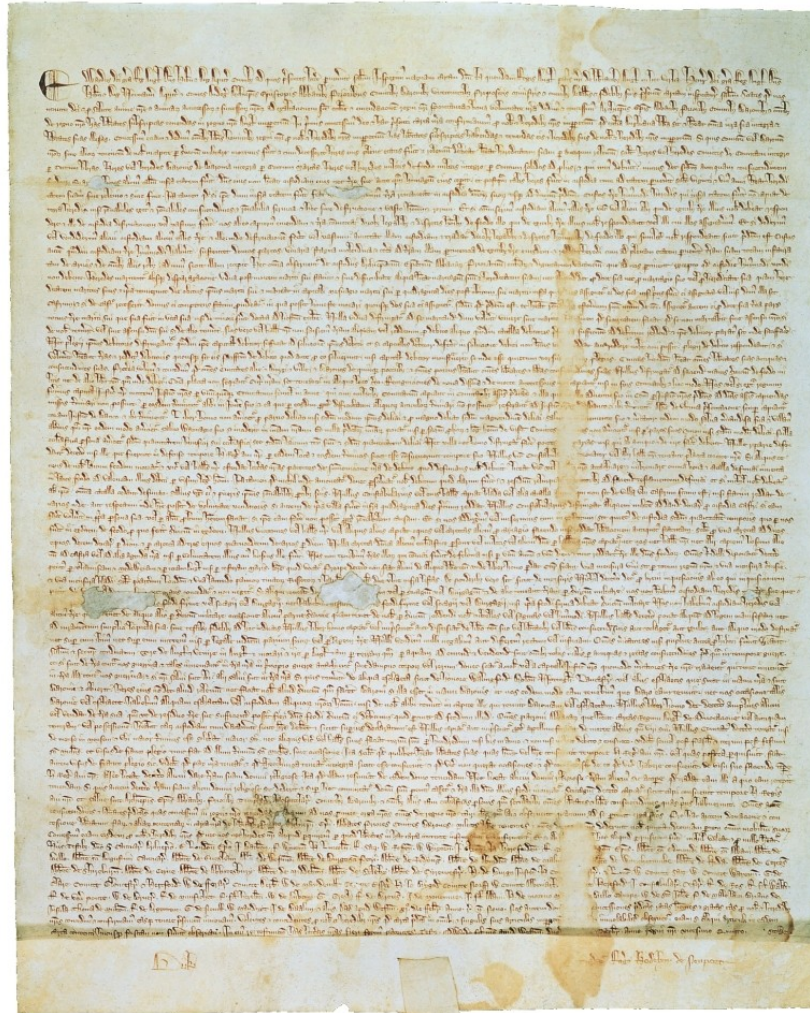
Permissionless: *Minority language groups*
